Charleston, W.Va. – When the West Virginia Chamber of Commerce's 78th Annual Meeting & Business Summit opens next Wednesday, August 27 at The Greenbrier, it will do so with a record attendance of nearly 800 registrants. The three-day meeting is the state's largest gathering of business, education and policy leaders.
