Huntington is the hub of a Tri-State region of over 360,000 good souls. It is noted for Marshall University, home of nearly 12,000 students, offering major medical, engineering and pharmacy graduate programs. Created in 1837 and named for US Supreme Court Justice John Marshall, the university is among the oldest institutions of higher learning west of the Allegheny Mountains.
