



Nestled in the Alleghany Mountains of West Virginia is a small town with a big draw. Named *America's Coolest Small Town* in 2011, Lewisburg is rich in Appalachian history and surrounded by an abundance of natural beauty. Unique art galleries and restaurants line downtown Washington Street. In Nearby White Sulphur Springs, the Greenbrier Resort attracts visitors from around the world.



Fast Facts:

- Just a few miles away, the 692 room Greenbrier Resort includes 30 unique shops, 10 restaurants and lounges, and is a stop on the PGA Tour.
- The Greenbrier is filled with fun for all ages including 55 outdoor activities; including a casino, spa, underground bunker tours golf, tennis, and infinity pool.
- Home to a school of Osteopathic medicine ranked one of the nation's top medical schools for the 20th consecutive year.
- Served by an airport with the state's longest runway.
- Nearby Lost World Caves and Organ Caves attract spelunkers from many areas.
- Home to one of the only eight Carnegie Halls still in continuous use in the world.
- Named after Andrew Lewis, a military officer and surveyor from colonial Virginia that came to the area to set up camp area near a spring which is, today, still known as Lewis Spring.
- Holds the annual West Virginia State Fair and Lewisburg Chocolate Festival.
- A few miles away is the "Coal House", the only house in the world built entirely out of coal.
- President John F. Kennedy stayed on a farm outlying Lewisburg while planning election strategies.
- Known for its 18th and 19th century buildings and beautiful antebellum homes.
