Alys lives in Huntington, WV with her husband, Brad D. Smith, and is a dedicated mother of two adult children, Devon and Payton.

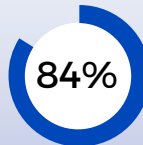

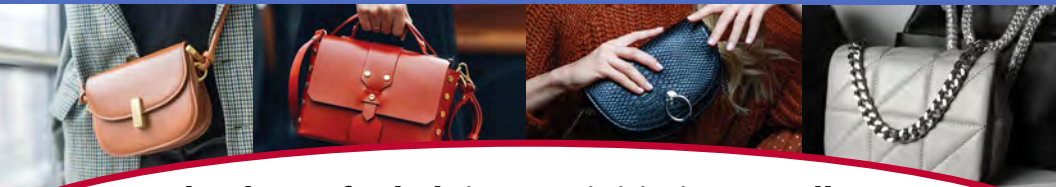

Before coming to the Chamber, Dembeck was a policy analyst on the Senate Republican Policy Committee, a legislative staffer for Senator Judd Gregg (R-NH), and a policy staffer on the House of Representatives Committee on Education and the Workforce. Dembeck also was Manager of Government Relations for Ceridian Corporation.

In addition to her role at the Chamber, Dembeck is a member of the Board of Directors for the National Skills Coalition, Women in Government Relations, and the MANA Action Fund.

She led the public relations efforts for worst case scenarios dialogues and lead negotiator of the WV Brownfields Redevelopment Act resulting in her being awarded the WV Environmental Institutes' award for achievement.

KATHY BECKETT has over thirty years of experience practicing environmental, regulatory, and natural resources law. She has a national reputation for her ability to influence environmental policies on behalf of her clients. She has been instrumental in the development of national and state regulatory programs and the drafting of environmental legislation. Kathy is the Team Leader of the firm's Environment, Social, Governance ("ESG") group of attorneys with experience and knowledge about how ESG impacts all aspects of business. She has

also worked Environmental Justice issues with USEPA. Kathy collaborates with a group of 15 experienced environmental lawyers and technical professionals. She is active in many industry trade groups and served on the Board of Directors of the U.S. Chamber of Commerce and chairs its Energy, Clean Air and Natural Resources Committee. She also serves on the Board of Directors of the West Virginia Chamber of Commerce and chairs its Environmental Committee. Kathy has served in a leadership role with the American Bar Association Section of Environment, Energy and Resources.

She is a Fellow of the American College of Environmental Lawyers and is rated in *Chambers USA* and *Lawdragon Green 500*. Kathy is a board member of the Black Diamond Council for the Girl Scouts serving multiple states.



THE HONORABLE SHELLEY MOORE CAPITO was first elected to the United States Senate in 2014, and re-elected in 2020. She is also the first female Senator in West Virginia's history and was elected with the largest margin of victory for a Republican in state history—winning more than 70 percent of the vote and all 55 counties, surpassing the previous mark she set in 2014 when she won more than 62 percent of the vote and all 55 counties. After serving West Virginia's Second Congressional District in the U.S. House of Representatives for 14 years,

and as a member of the West Virginia House of Delegates for four years prior, Senator Capito decided to run for Senate to be an even stronger voice for the Mountain State.

Senator Capito currently serves on the Appropriations Committee; the Commerce, Science, and Transportation Committee; the Rules and Administration Committee; and the Environment and Public Works Committee as Ranking Member. A lifelong West Virginian herself, Senator Capito was born in Glen Dale in the Northern Panhandle. She holds a B.S. in Zoology from Duke University and a M.Ed. from the University of Virginia. She and her husband Charles L. Capito Jr. reside in Charleston. They have three adult children: two sons, Charles (wife Laura) and Moore, and one daughter, Shelley (husband Colin Macleod). They have also been blessed with eight grandchildren: Celia, Charlie, Eliza, Rose, Arch, Macaulay, Lewis, and Thomas.

Dr. Campbell-Monroe serves the community as Treasurer for the Dunbar Athletic Boosters, Inc., and Chair of the Arthritis Foundation West Virginia Leadership Board. In 2020, Dr. Campbell was named a West Virginia Wonder Woman by *WV Living Magazine*. In 2022, Dr. Campbell-Monroe was installed as the President of the National Association of Medical Minority Educators, Inc., (NAMME) where she will serve a two-year term.

MESHEA L. POORE, ESQ., a long-time champion of underrepresented people, serves as WVU's Vice President of Diversity, Equity and Inclusion and Chief Diversity Officer.

She is an attorney and former public defender who served in the WV House of Delegates from 2009-2014. She's also an accomplished and sought-after motivational speaker, public and political leadership consultant and strategist.

In 2017, she became the first African American woman named President of the West Virginia State Bar since its 1947 founding.

She is President of the Big 12 Association of Diversity Officers in Higher Education and a member of the executive committee for the Council on Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion for the Association of Public and Land-Grant Universities.

Poore earned her bachelor's degree from Howard University in Washington, D.C., her law degree from Southern University Law Center in Baton Rouge, Louisiana, and is a graduate of the Women's Campaign School at Yale University and the German Marshall Memorial Fellowship.



SUSAN LAVENSKI is the CEO and owner of Charles Ryan Associates (CRA), one of the region's oldest and largest communications firms headquartered in Charleston, West Virginia, with an office in Richmond, Virginia. The firm is one of the largest women-owned communications firms in the region.

Susan is an expert in issues management and has spearheaded the communications efforts for transportation campaigns, utility, energy and manufacturing projects, controversial elections and health care certificates of need. She has provided strategy for Fortune 500 businesses and worked with local, regional and national public figures, media representatives and business executives. Her work has produced results that garnered state, regional and national coverage for her clients.

Susan has worked at CRA for 24 years. She is a graduate of Marshall University, where she received a Bachelor of Arts degree in public relations journalism and a Master of Arts degree in political science with a concentration in public administration.

In addition to her duties as the CEO at CRA, Susan also serves as the CEO of the Onva Company, a real estate property company owned by her family. She also serves on several boards and committees and has received many recognitions for her work.

JILL SCARBRO is the CEO of Bright Futures Learning Services in Putnam County and the 2022 U.S. Small Business Administration's National Small Businessperson of the Year.

Jill has provided Applied Behavior Analysis services to individuals with autism and other disabilities since 1997. Jill earned her Bachelor of Special Education with concentrations in mental impairments and physical handicaps from Marshall University in 1999. She continued her focus on autism intervention by receiving a Master of Science in Behavior Analysis from the University of North Texas in 2004. After operating a private practice in Texas, Jill and her daughter Caroline returned home to West Virginia in 2006, where Jill became the first Board Certified Behavior Analyst (BCBA) in southern West Virginia, and Director/Owner of Bright Futures Learning Services. As a founding member of Mountaineer Autism Project, she worked to pass autism insurance legislation and continues to work towards systems change that will enable access to behavior analytic services in WV. Jill is a founding member and past President of the West Virginia Behavior Analysis Association, and founder of Community Autism Resources and Education Systems (CARES). In 2019 she was named WV's Woman-Owned Small Business of the Year by the WV Small Business Administration and was inducted into WV Executive's inaugural Health Care Hall of Fame in 2020.



DR. HANNAH W. HAZARD-JENKINS, MD, FACS is an Associate Professor and Associate Chair of Cancer Services in the Department of Surgery and the Director of the West Virginia University (WVU) Cancer Institute. She received her medical degree from the WVU School of Medicine and went on to complete her surgical residency at WVU. She continued her surgical training in Chicago with a year fellowship in Breast Diseases at Northwestern University. Dr. Hazard-Jenkins returned to WVU as faculty in the Department of Surgery in 2007. As

faculty in the School of Medicine, she held numerous roles culminating in Assistant Dean for Admissions. She subsequently transitioned to cancer center leadership first fulfilling the role of Cancer Service Line Director and then Director of Clinical Services. In January of 2020, she took over the role of Director of the WVU Cancer Institute where she has led the expansion of regional cancer center sites and supported the development of the LUCAS, a WVU Cancer Institute mobile lung cancer screening unit, with the mission to bring high quality, state of the art cancer care to all that live in West Virginia and the surrounding region.

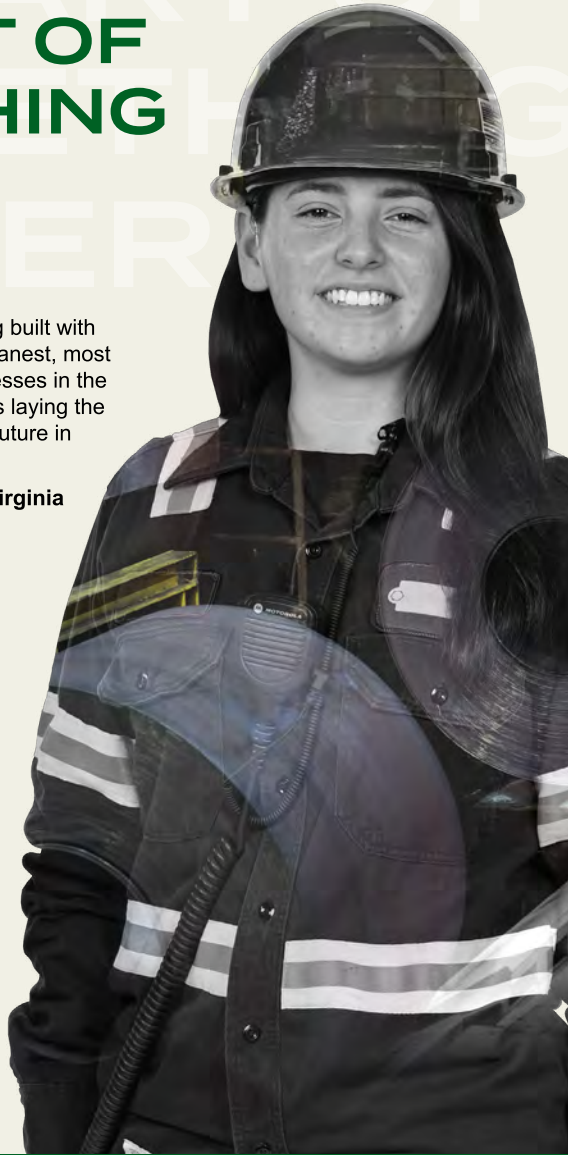

THE HONORABLE CAROL MILLER represents West Virginia's First Congressional District. Miller serves on the Committee on Ways and Means. Miller's focus in Congress is creating jobs, diversifying the economy, innovating and improving infrastructure, protecting America's borders, and supporting West Virginia's energy industries like coal, oil, and gas. Prior to her election to Congress in 2018, Congresswoman Miller served in the West Virginia House of Delegates from 2006 to 2018 where she rose to become the first female Majority Whip.

A mother of two and grandmother of seven, Carol Miller is married to her husband Matt, and lives in Huntington, where she owns and operates Swann Ridge Bison Farm and manages real estate. Miller was born in Columbus, Ohio and is the daughter of Congressman Samuel L. Devine and Betty Devine.



JILL CRANSTON RICE is a Partner in the Morgantown office of Dinsmore & Shohl LLP, where she serves on the Firm's Board of Directors and co-chairs the firm's Health Law and Public Policy Practice Group. She has an active commercial litigation practice representing insurance companies, hospital systems, financial institutions, and small and large businesses. She serves as President of the West Virginia Insurance Federation and is the lead lobbyist for the property and casualty insurance industry in West Virginia.

Jill chairs the Highland-Clarksburg Hospital Board of Directors, serves on the DRI Board of Directors, and is a Past President of the Defense Trial Counsel of West Virginia. 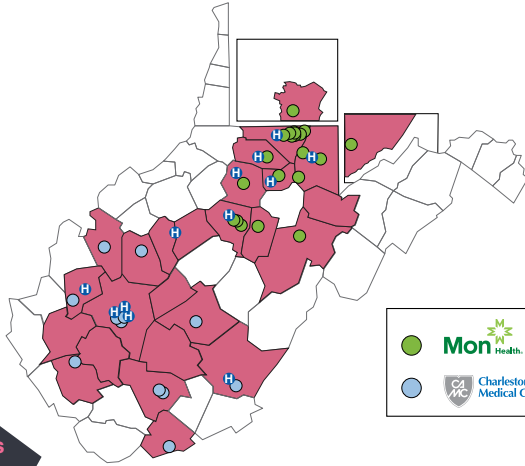
